

## Minutes of Committee Meeting 31.01.20 to finalise plans for MUGA Madness

1. Charity bucket collection  
Permit application made for 01.03.20 for Solomon's temple and fun run date 14.03.20
2. Re-usable cups, price is £350 for 250 cups (half pint with school logo on). Agreed NW to check cost of pint glasses before making final decision.
3. £5 rewards, there are sufficient funds in the account to purchase £5 reward for assembly. To check with LP if there is a parent in reception who has links to opera house as school council has requested rewards change to £5 vouchers for cinema.
4. Banner for "Pitch In", NW organising this, £54 for 2x5ft banner.
5. Grants discussed. Applications made to Persimmon Homes for £1000 (find out at end of Feb), Tesco bags of help grant was rejected "as other projects demonstrated greater community involvement". Agreed would wait to submit applications to Sports England and the FA following advice from Derbyshire FA, as these take account of other grants applied for, so if Tarmac is not successful would be worth applying for one or both of these for a substantial grant.
6. MUGA plans:
  - a. Solomon's temple walk meet 2pm, do cakes, biscuits, hot and cold drinks at temple for donations. Ask for donations/just giving
  - b. Crossfit 11am-7.30pm Sat 7<sup>th</sup> March, teams of 3-6 for an hour on ski, row and bike, £10 per person, can accommodate 4 teams at a time. Prize for entry and for furthest distance. Do refreshments for donations.
  - c. Fun run, committee meeting for athletics club is not until end of month, also discussed problems of younger children running at same time as more competitive adults, if hold event after main race, then reliant on marshals staying for longer. Agreed if possible would hold event at school instead on last weekend Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> March, ask athletics club if can borrow stop watches etc. Do refreshments for donations. If permit granted, could hold cake sale on 14<sup>th</sup> at end of 5k in pavilion gardens.
  - d. Football match at Silverlands, 13<sup>th</sup> 6-8pm, bar and café open but will not give a share of the profits. Can charge entry £5 adults, £2.50 kids. Speed cage TBC if this date is possible.
  - e. Pool, discussed different options, but this is largely dependent on number of lifeguards required, SH to check price implications of this and available dates. [following meeting, no availability for pool on weekend in March so agreed not to pursue this option]
  - f. Cycle ride, Hassop station, David Halliday to organise, different options suggested but agreed Hassop was best option, particularly if we can get discounted bike hire and to stress have had offers to transport people and bikes if required.

- g. Clubbercise, Sue requested that we charge same rate as her paid classes to prevent her from potentially losing money on these, agreed therefore £6 per person. To ask AT to check if we can use Community School Hall as this is larger.
- h. Pilates with Lauren, £6 so same price as clubbercise
- i. Kids sponsored event, confirm AT in agreement to have this is sports relief week but proceeds to go to MUGA.

To send letter to parents and advertise all events on facebook ideally by end of next week to give plenty of notice about MUGA events.
